Farm Succession—the transfer of the farming enterprise from one generation to the next—is most often a gradual process.

The traditional progression begins with a transfer of labor and farm income, then a gradual transfer of management and control, and eventually the transfer of farm assets—first farm chattels such as livestock or farm equipment and then farm land. Each family follows its own course, and in practice the progression is rarely a neat and orderly process.
